Tribute to Nina

Nina Anderson first attended WBQG right before COVID hit and then the pandemic struck and we were all isolated to our homes. During that time Nina was also confronted with a stark reality of a blood cancer diagnosis and underwent a stem cell transplant. She survived the harsh side effects of the procedure. Nina was a fighter.

When she finally had the ability, Nina became an active member of the Plantation United Methodist Church quilting club. It was her safe haven as she continued to grow stronger. Nina thrived in the atmosphere of this small group where she could sit and do her own projects while teaching others various quilting techniques. Nina engaged the group in one quilting venture after another. She let us complete our assignments on our time not hers. Nina loved sharing her wisdom.

Eventually, Nina returned to WBQG and immediately took leadership positions as program chair and then workshop chair. She flourished in quilting environments. Nina was engaged at our meetings and she looked at ways for us to build a stronger guild. She challenged us with new techniques and encouraged us to be better quilters. She had incorporated videos in our newsletter to assist us with our quilting process. The guild needed Nina and she needed us.

Nina was our friend. Her home was always open to quilters who needed some help with their quilting dilemmas. Nina shared her knowledge and experience with great joy. Nina was instrumental in piecing our guild quilt that won first place in the SFQE. Her own finished quilts were masterpieces of art.

I am grateful that Nina lived closed to me. I don't remember how many times I would speed to her home with questions and problems. She was one of my mentors in quilting. It was Nina who showed me a method to match my seams in perfection.

There were other techniques that Nina utilized in piecing quilts that was easier and simpler and different than I had traditionally learned. What I truly appreciated about Nina was after I finished one quilt top, she asked me if I would like some feedback.

She just did not critique my work but asked for permission first. Of course, I certainly wanted to learn why I struggled with this quilt. I discovered so much from her and I am a better quilter.

Nina was always wanting to advance our guild and we would talk at length about various opportunities. The last few weeks before her death we spoke about the guild and how much more she wanted to give back and teach us. Nina was a great inspiration and made a difference in our lives. She was a champion quilter and always found joy in her work and in helping others. More importantly, Nina was our dear friend and we will miss her.


I am including the pictures and thank you letter from Showering Love.

Thank you to everyone inspired by the Jenifer McShane-directed Netflix documentary *The Quilters* to reach out to the Missouri Department of Corrections and offer donations and words of support. We, too, are moved by the film and are awestruck by the generous and beautiful work done by Missourians in our Restorative Justice Organization programs.

In addition to South Central Correctional Center (SCCC), the department supports quilting programs at multiple other sites. Donations of quilting supplies and equipment are needed and appreciated. However, we currently are OVERWHELMED by donations and are running out of storage space for fabric and yarn.

Please consider a <u>monetary donation</u> to our Restorative Justice Organization programs, all of which rely on donations and volunteers.

RJO programs throughout the state give residents of our facilities the chance to give back to the community in many ways, including:
