CHAT WITH TONYA

What does your quilt say about you?

Your quilting, stitch by stitch, weaves your story into your quilts. How would you define your story? Do you use patterns or create your own? Do you like to applique, paper piece or make quilts with blocks? Are you a modern quilter? Do you like to make your own art quilts Do you like traditional quilting? Do you have favorite colors that you consistently use in your quilting? All this and more identifies you as an individual and unique quilter. This is your story.

A few months ago, I was at *Quilt A Bit* and the owner, Dawn, was out on the floor pulling batik fabrics. When I got closer to her, I saw that she had a beautiful picture of a fox quilt. Of course, I was captivated, especially since Fox is my maiden name. I have always had a spot in my heart for foxes We spoke for several minutes and she related that she had recently finished the "Legit Kit" quilt called Flamingos. Dawn showed me the finished piece! It was beautiful! (She related that she loves paper piecing.)

Now, Dawn is busy making kits for the fox. I promptly asked her to add my name to acquire one. Additionally, I wanted the final fox size reduced by 25 percent. Eventually, I received a call from the store saying that my kit was ready. It was a costly project but I was ready to start this new endeavor. Actually, I was petrified because I have only done a little paper piecing.

Anyway, Dawn spent time showing me how to cut the fabric and stay organized. This is a very critical aspect for this quilt. She did an incredible job arranging the fabric and numbering and lettering all of the pieces. Dawn did the planning but now I need to start cutting. There are so many pieces to be cut. Dawn told me that it would take me 30 hours just to cut my fabric and then the sewing would begin. This is a challenge but it will be part of my story when the quilt is completed. The quilt will recognize my maiden name. I only wish my mother and father were still alive to see the finished fox quilt.

This fox quilt is only one part of my story. Since I love to fly fish, the tropics and marine life are incorporated into many of my quilts. Additionally, I have a barn quilt waiting for me to cut, piece and quilt as a symbol of my days growing up on a farm I like bright and bold colors in my quilts because I want my quilts to stand out. I have not really embraced any particular quilting style and I am always open to learning something new.

I am looking forward to the Bonnie Hunter mystery quilt. This will be an exciting group undertaking with several members at WBQG taking part in this project. This mystery quilt will add a new dimension to our quilting journey.

Your quilting technique and the types of quilts you make tell your story. The quilt may be a gift or it may be for charity or you may keep it for yourself. Be proud of your finished quilt because it is a masterpiece which you created and stitched with love and joy.


